The spirit of Revenge promises that by the play's end, Don Andrea will see his revenge.


Given this originary status, it is surprising that *The Spanish Tragedy* has never been fully staged in a manner that emulates the theatrical conditions under which it was first produced. None of the contemporary companies dedicated to reconstructing "Original Practices," a group that includes the London Globe; the Kensington Rose; the American Shakespeare Center; the Atlanta Shakespeare Tavern; and the New England Shakespeare Festival, have mounted Kyd's play. Looking back a century to the origins of this movement (then known as the "Elizabethan Revival"), neither William Poel nor his prolific disciple Nugent Monck ever attempted *The Spanish Tragedy*.

The Baron's Men production at the Curtain amphitheater in Austin will therefore be the first major "Original-Practice" staging since the seventeenth century. - Joe Falocco
