WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST & CREW

Dawn is a founding member of The Baron's Men and the current President. She portrayed Emilia in TBM's original production of *Comedy of Errors*. Her first love, though, is costume design. Recent designs for TBM are *Love's Labour's Lost, The Curate Shakespeare As You Like It*, and TBM original show *The Dead Of Winter* (with Cherie Weed). She is a 3-time B. Iden Payne nominee with one BIP award for costume design. Dawn is excited to mentor the next generation of Elizabethan costumers. She is married to TBM founding member Steve Hemphill and in their spare time they enjoy renovating their 100+ year old haunted house.

Leonard is a free-range, 100% organic creative living at the intersection of memory and dream, though his physical form resides in Austin, Texas. He continually aspires toward mastery of several endeavors, including singing, acting, writing, improv, and game design (both digital and analog). Astonishingly, people have even paid him for doing a few of these things on occasion – just ask Google. He last appeared in Austin-area theatre as Raven in The Hideout Theatre's production of The Tribunal. This is his debut show with The Baron's Men, and he is grateful for the opportunity. He dedicates this performance to his cat, Kiki, and to all the nobles among you just waiting for your moment. You know who you are, and you are seen.

Mike Crugnola is an actor, improviser, and podcaster based in Austin. This is technically his second show with The Baron's Men and first time getting to perform onstage at The Curtain, and he couldn't be more excited. Previously, he'd been cast as Francis Flute in *A Midsummer Night's Dream* before rupturing his Achilles forgetting his age at a punk show in Chicago. Other roles have included Benedick in *Much Ado About Nothing* with Walking Shadow Shakespeare Project, Deeran with the improvised 5th Edition Dungeons & Dragons Actual Play Podcast Adventure Incorporated, a handful of improv troupes over the years, and more college theatre and Zoom pandemic performances than he can possibly remember, but certainly less than his wife. He's over the moon about this opportunity, and is also so excited for Memorial Day weekend, where he'll play lachimo in *Cymbeline* with Walking Shadow at Ramsey Park!

Stephanie is so thrilled for the opportunity to be on The Curtain stage again with The Baron's Men! Past roles with TBM include Puck (*Midsummer*), Prince Hal in Henry IV.i, and Witch #3 (*Macbeth*)! Stephanie is the Artistic Director of Walking Shadow Shakespeare Project (@wsshakes - instagram), a Shakespeare company that specializes in abridged, interactive shows for in-school performances and one-rehearsal PopUp productions – keep an eye out for Shakespeare's *Cymbeline* in Ramsey Park on May 28, 2023! Additionally, she hosts Protest too Much: A Shakespeare Showdown Podcast (@p2mpod - twitter, ig, tiktok), featuring many familiar TBM voices! Aaron Niemuth was part of the crew for The Baron's Men's first full-length production back in 2002, and after that there was no getting rid of him. He has appeared onstage in many TBM productions, notably as one of the twinned Antipholi (Antipholuses??) in Comedy of Errors (the first time around), Malvolio in Twelfth Night, Hortensio in Taming of the Shrew, and Benedick in 2015's Much Ado About Nothing. In addition to many onstage appearances with The Baron's Men, Aaron co-wrote and co-directed 2014's A Tale of Robyn Hoode and 2017's The Dead of Winter. His third, fourth, and fifth plays are in varying stages of development, depending on how you count that thing where you have a brilliant idea but then something bright and shiny catches your eye and then you mostly forget it. Playing Polixenes in The Winter's Tale will be Aaron's eleventy bajillionth time onstage with The Baron's Men, but who's counting? Renee was most recently seen on stage as Dromio of Ephesus in *Comedy of Errors* and Trinculo in *The Tempest*. Other past roles with The Baron's Men have included *Measure for Measure* (Servant/Prostitute /Nun), *Much Ado About Nothing* (Margaret), *The Dead of Winter* (Grace) and *Love's Labour's Lost* (Maria). Upon joining the troupe in 2015, she has been helping wherever and whenever she can, including serving as Treasurer on the Board of Directors since 2018.

This show marks the start of Lindsay's 13th season with The Baron's Men, many of which she spent in Board service, and the two most recent as one of TBM's Co-Artistic Directors. Some favorite roles: Juliet (*Romeo & Juliet*), Beatrice (*Much Ado About Nothing*), Co-Lucifer with Jimmie Bragdon (*Doctor Faustus*), Constance (*The Dead of Winter*), Porter (*Macbeth*), and Helena (*A Midsummer Night's Dream*) with TBM, and Brodysseus in *The Brojan War, a new musical by Bromer* (Best of Week at FronteraFest 2019). Lindsay has served many roles backstage including directing *Lysistrata, Lysistrata Rises Again*, and *The Tempest*, and costume designing both shows last season. 


