# Director's Note

Throughout Twelfth Night, its leading ladies, Viola and Olivia, serve as reflections of one another. Both women veil their faces from the world, rather than walk openly with their grief, picking and choosing which aspects of themselves to lay bare. Our twins, Viola and Sebastian, mirror each other in more literal ways: they look alike, they both believe the other to be dead, and Viola in her disguise as Cesario imitates her brother in "fashion, color, ornament". And then, Olivia and Orsino go about in nearly identical, mirrored movements – pining after the one person who will not love them, sending messages from afar, and only ever meeting when both deign to finally leave their houses and show the world their faces. The many veils in Twelfth Night may protect their wearers from unwanted advances, but ultimately, hiding only stands in the way of a happy ending. While disguised, all grief and love mingle and grow tangled, like vines that have been left without a gardener and allowed to go wild and untamed. Only when the gate is opened to receive the love of another and the veil removed does the garden begin to bloom.
