Director's Note

I have always loved Halloween: the decorating, the tradition of carving pumpkins and then baking the seeds, and of course the occasional scary movie to celebrate. When I heard that TBM had once done a spooky show called *Medieval Macabre*, I was all aglow with wonder. Fast forward to 2020, when many theaters, including TBM, turned to live Zoom or other pre-recorded online performances. Inspired by *Medieval Macabre*, Laura Trezise, Liegh Toland, and I created a video montage for a Halloween celebration using some scenes from Shakespeare, Marlow, and Middleton, as well as ancient folklore. We hosted a live watch party on Halloween night, and it was so much fun! We couldn't help but wonder – could this ever happen on stage? In 2023, Renee Osborn and I approached Pablo Muñoz-Evers to see if he would be interested in writing a story to bind together some of the scenes we had used online in 2020. Lucky for us, he was!

From the beginning, we knew we wanted to do something that didn't have as long of a rehearsal process and run of a full-length play. We wanted to allow some of our old and new friends who can't always commit to a full-length show to still play and have fun. The rehearsal process was so much fun, and getting to see fellow actors laugh and explore some dark stuff was great. (The first rehearsal with water-filled squibs was memorable, to say the least.)

I also knew I wanted blood, Foley (non amplified sound effects), lots of colored lights, and a set that looked like an abandoned castle in the forest. Edwin Wise, Michael Osborn, Jimmie Bragdon, and Laura Trezise have all offered their expertise in these respective areas, and the show wouldn't be the same without them.

So, there's the back story of how this little show was born. I invite you to sit back and just enjoy the experience of a dark night with The Baron's Men out at the magical Curtain Theater.
